(Question): Holidays

What is a Holiday? How would you tell someone what a Holiday is?

- a day of festivity or recreation when no work is done.
- a day fixed by law or custom on which ordinary business is suspended in commemoration of some event or in honor of some person. any day of exemption from work
- a day for celebrating or remembering a special event, especially one on which many people are allowed not to go to work or school: the Fourth of July holiday. There are several holidays which revolve around religious events/dates.

Key Truth:

"Holidays, like many other aspects of our culture, can hold various levels of *grey area* for Chrisitians. As with other worldview subjects - a Believer must weigh their motivation, activity, & conviction against what they know to be true & in line with scriptural."

Note: Many of the Holidays that we are aware of and celebrate or observe hold ties to old, if not ancient, cult & occult practices & pagan rituals. The foundations of many things we see as harmless and normal actually had their foundations rooted in beliefs and religious practice we wouldn't want anything to do with. ALSO, through the years, many of our ideas and customs have been sculpted and morphed - Lots of our holidays have had a heavy dose of the Catholic Church rearranging or editing things to arrive at something you recognize today. Sometimes the church would "arrange" things for a holiday to crush a pagan holiday...and of course most of this is ancient history which is also twisted and turned and pieced together.
